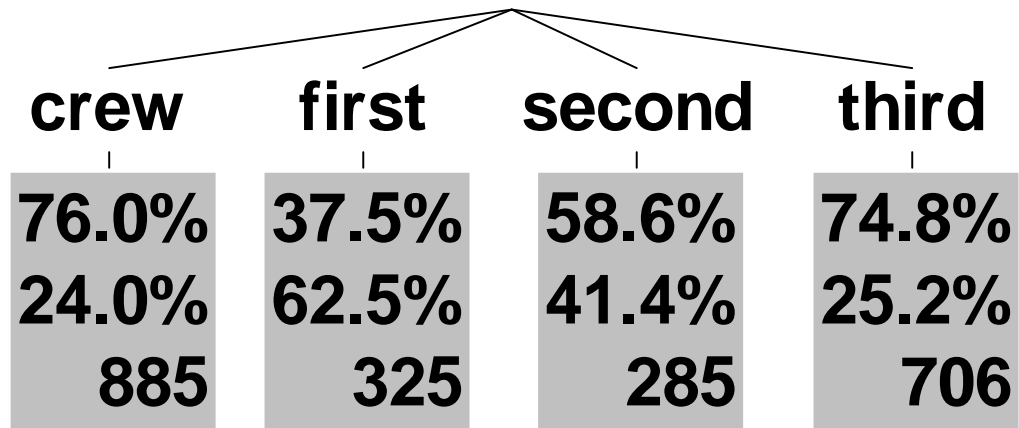

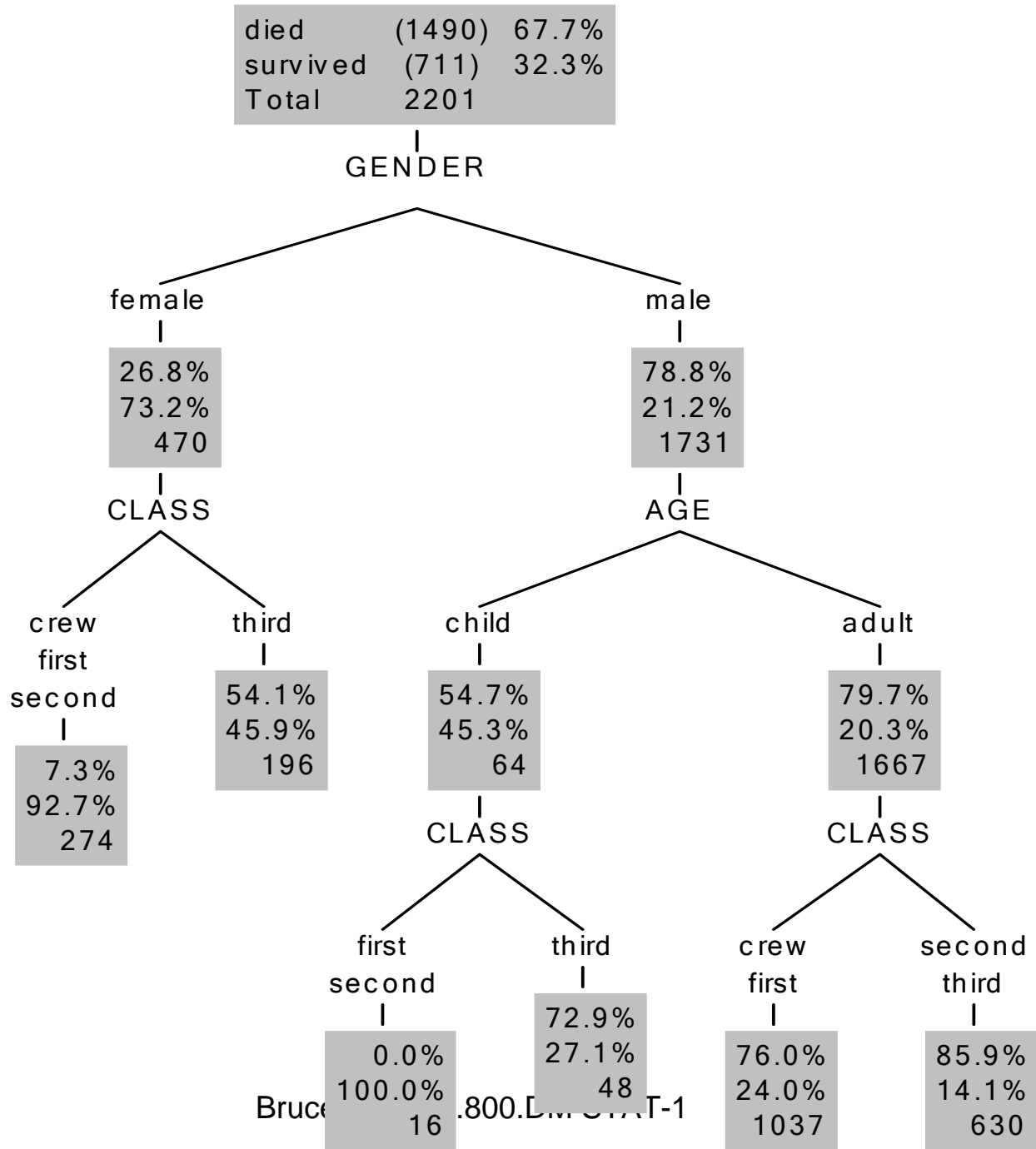

# CHAID-based Logistic Regression Model (LRM)

- $\text{logit}(\text{Survived}) =$   
- 1.30 + 1.89\*female + 1.10\*first  
+ 0.59\*second - 0.68\*madlt\_23\*
- **SCC|PS = % Survivors Correctly Classified  
among those Predicted Survivors**

\* madlt\_23 = 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> class male adults

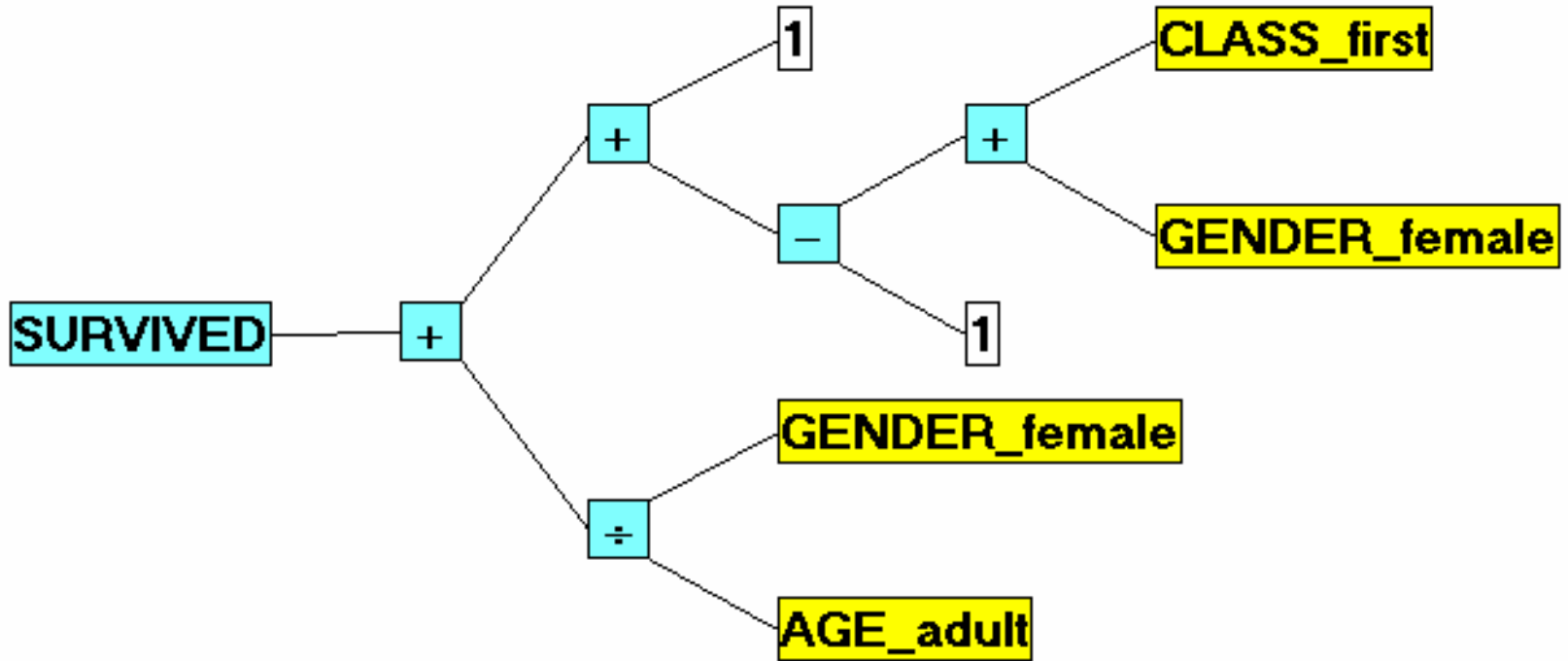
## Logistic Regression Model: SCC|PS = 60.05%

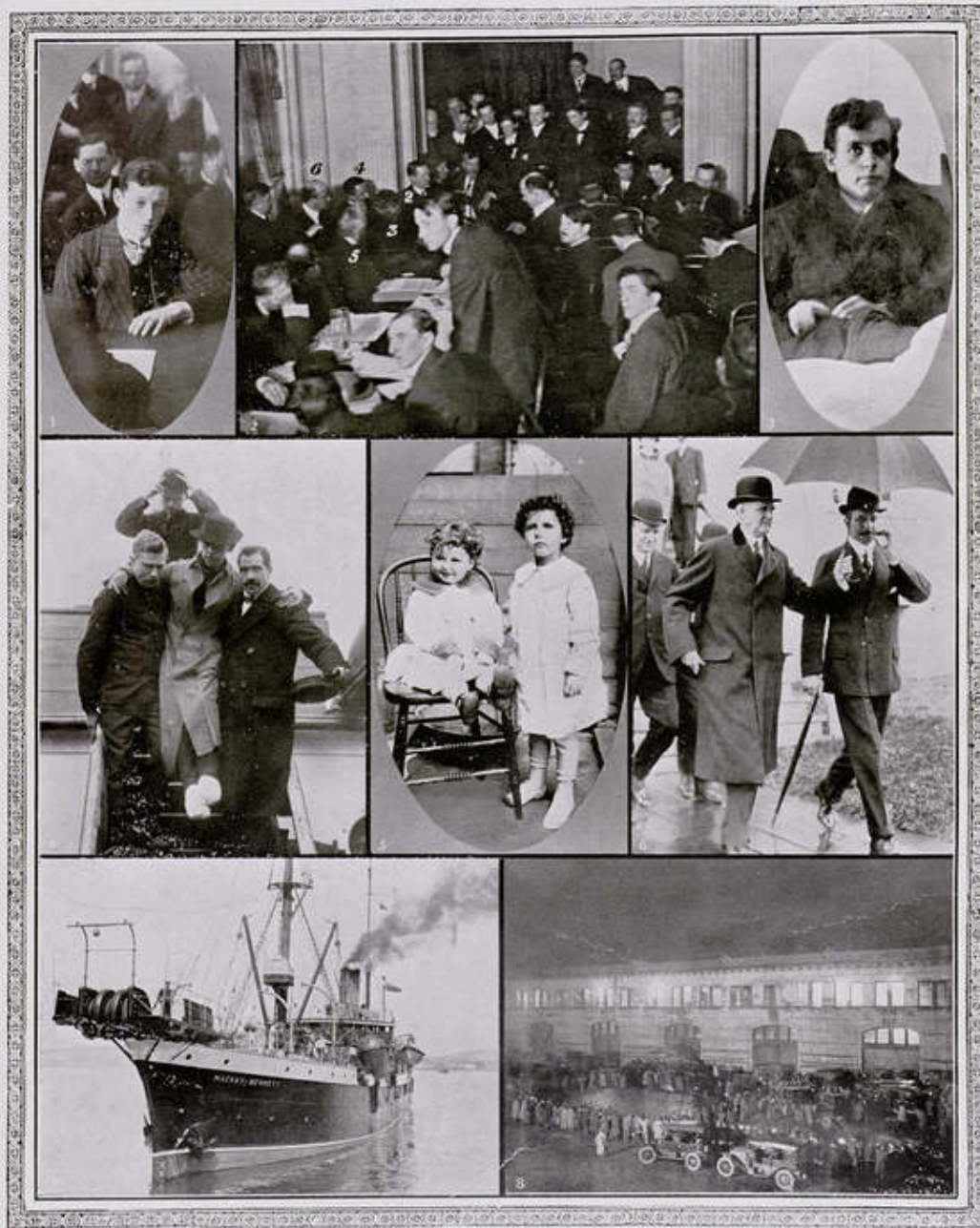

- **GenIQ Model IMPROVEMENT over LRM**
- **0.95% (= 60.62%/60.05%)**
- **4 survivors (that is a lot if they are your family)**

# Last U.S. survivor of Titanic sinking, 99, dies

## Lillian Gertrud Asplund was 5 when liner sank in North Atlantic in 1912

BOSTON - Lillian Gertrud Asplund, the last American survivor of the sinking of the Titanic in 1912, has died, a funeral home said Sunday. She was 99.

Asplund, who was just 5 years old, lost her father and three brothers — including a fraternal twin — when the “practically unsinkable” ship went down in the North Atlantic after hitting an iceberg.

She died Saturday at her home in Shrewsbury, said Ronald E. Johnson, vice president of the Nordgren Memorial Chapel in Worcester, Mass.
